All of their good wishes for the Centre's future success and their recognition of the immense dedication and work undertaken to achieve community governance were qualified by their recognition that the hard

work to make community governance a real success was only just commencing. Indeed, as Priya Thamotheram said on that evening, "Political independence without economic independence was a sure fire recipe for disaster, as many third world countries had experienced since their achievement of political independence".

A particular highlight of the evening was the screening of a special DVD of the near 14 year journey to community governance, in the context of the over 25 year struggle to retain an independent approach to socially and economically regenerating the Highfields area through underpinning the Centre's work with an educational and progressive ethos. It reminded all present of the pain and agony, as well as the lost opportunities caused by the many unnecessary obstacles which had to be overcome. But equally, it chartered the magnificent response of the Centre's users, staff and Governing Body in overcoming those barriers and the ways in which they were helped to do so by friends and supporters from far and wide.

Whilst the current economic climate is not particularly conducive to publicly funded services, the Centre's role as a trusted community anchor, together with its successful experience and track record in initiating and providing valued lifelong learning and community development services places it in a very good position to work with local partners in ensuring the Centre's on-going success. A first step on that road is the first ever Highfields Festival scheduled for 23rd and 24th July 2011 and we would be delighted to see you over that weekend!

Shaheen has worked hard to scoop two Learner of the Year awards for the Certificate in Advice Work course she has successfully completed at Highfields Centre. The course is accredited by Leicester University and she was awarded the University's Philip Collins Award at a ceremony held in February 2011. Highfields Centre also recognised her achievements at the last Adult Certificate presentation evening by awarding her the Student of the Year Award.

It has been a remarkable achievement for Shaheen as she has only been in the UK since 2004. Shaheen has two young children and she has been successful at managing her responsibilities at home and completing her assignments for the course. After receiving help from her Personal Adviser at Highfields Multi-Access Centre with job search and employment preparation, Shaheen has found temporary work in her chosen field as Welfare Rights Officer at Highfields Centre.

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CENTRE TO RUN PILOT ARTS AWARD SCHEME

The Centre has been accepted as a pilot centre for the new Arts Award pilot scheme aimed at 7 to 11 year olds. We are only now begining to use the Arts Award in a meaningful now in the Centre with young people who attend and this pilot will enable us to work with local primary schools in the area as part of our arts and sports 'offer'.

We are the only centre chosen in Leicester for the pilot and we have just completed the training to deliver this work so watch this space.

We will continue to offer the orginal Arts Award for children/young people over the age of 11yrs but we will accept young people who are 10 yrs so we can do preparation work with them so they are ready for the course. Key aspects:

- A great way for young people to explore creative skills
- A nationally recognised qualification @ Bronze, Sliver & Gold levels
- A framework for learning new skills and sharing them
- A link between young people and creative professionals in arts and media
- A rapidly growing award that can be achieved throughout England
- Range of arts covered drama, music, visual arts, dance, video, photography

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Each child/young person doing the qualification at the Bronze level will attend a weekly arts session at the centre, attend an arts event externally and help run an arts activity as well as completing a portfolio of evidence. This is a level one qualification and if they wish to progress the Silver & Gold qualification these are equivalent to GCSE & A level standards.

EASTER PROJECT 2011 - A BIG SUCCESS



On April 28th towards the end of the Easter holidays trainee FJF Youth Support Workers and Reminiss – young people's social enterprise group that we are working with put on a showcase music and fashion show event in the main hall. The youth group and workers had been planning this event from February as part of developing a project for their YMCA Level 3 qualification and for further develop the profile of Reminiss locally. For two months there were a numner of planning meetings, auditions and during the holidays a number of rehearsals. More than 200 young people attended the final event listening to local MC's and artists as well as fashion show.

New Sports Classes Introduced

Since the last edition, the centre has introduced new sports classes for all to enjoy. The latest addition is the Zumba classes, which place Friday 5:15 - 6:15p.m for females only. Also, female badminton sessions run Sunday 4 - 6p.m. Also female only gym sessions run Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

The sports team are still running the ususal sessions which include Community Badminton sessions, Gym sessions, Sauna Sessions, Football skills development (5 - 12 years old) and Karate.

Over the summer, the sports team at the centre will be hosting several football tournaments, so make your to enter your team as soon as you can.

HCA was successful in its bid to take part in the scheme to provide temporary work, support and training to forty young people. They later went on to successfully apply for Working Neighbourhood Funds which led to some of the participants' contracts being extended to 12 months.

The end of scheme evaluation conducted by Bob Clark Associates identified the following key findings Those involved felt HCA had supported the participants to gain a variety of qualifications and experience for their future.

- All support planned for participants were achieved in Training, Education and Employment and participants stated the temporary job experience was very effective and that they had gained greatly from both the positive and negative experiences.
- Without exception, the Partner Agencies supported the principle and objectives of the scheme and felt that the programme should have been longer to achieve further benefits for the participants. All partner agencies were pleased to have taken part in HCA's arrangement.
- Whilst some participants felt that training did not always match the job description and felt the scheme was challenging, all acknowledged a sense of achievement in gaining good work experience from Partner Agencies, with the majority achieving their personal goals.
- All participants have left the scheme achieving an accredited qualification.
- The experience gained by all the stakeholders from the organisation of this scheme can easily be replicated for similar training and development programmes.
- 90% of participants successfully completed the scheme.
- There were 44 courses or training experiences made available to all participants.
- The destinations of the 41 participants were as follows:
