Community Governance well on track!





Elizabeth Ball, Paul Davies and Carl Towner, consultants from Development Trusts Association (DTA) are providing advice and training to Highfields Community Association (HCA), the Interim Strategic Management Board (ISMB) and Leicester City Council to establish Community Governance of Highfields Centre (HC). DTA are also assisting other pilot authorities in the national Asset Transfer programme.

Progress towards Community Governance was given a further boost when the ISMB met on 9th April and agreed phase 1 transfers should be completed by December 2008!

This means the transfer of Highfields Centre, equipment , Arts, Sports and Community Services to HCA .

Phase 2 will deal with other services and resources based at HC.

Sir Peter Soulsby (MP) as chief guest and Cllr Patrick Kitterick presided over the official launch of H-MAC (Highfields Multi-Access Centre) on 25th February 2008, a major new project funded by the City Strategy initiative. Leicester City Council's Culture and Regeneration Department provides the lead

on this initiative. Celebrating the launch also included speeches from Priva Thamotheram,



Head of Centre, Jim Connelly, District Manager of Leicestershire and Northamptonshire Jobcentre Plus and Chris Minter, Head of Adult Skills and Learning Service, Leicester City Council.

Staff team consist of a Personal Advisor, Advice Officer, Employer Engagement Officer, Adult Learning Coordinator and administration assistant.

Advisors will support local people residing primarily in the Spinney Hills area because it is in the top five per cent of the most deprived areas in the country. It is characterised by high levels of social and economic deprivation.

H-MAC aims to support people who have or are facing particular difficulties in entering the labour market. Specialist advisors are available to help overcome barriers that people face when looking for jobs, including childcare, disability, transport, immigration or benefits.

Sat 23 Feb 2008 They get free mobiles...don't they Leicester Civil Rights Movement hosted this multimedia documentary theatre production from Birmingham-based Banner Theatre which sets out to bust some of the myths about refugees and asylum seekers. Combining music, song, video, film and theatre, it speaks for asylum seekers in their quest for safety

and security after fleeing war-torn lands in Africa and the Middle East. It tells the human stories of people in the wrong place at the wrong time, and cuts through the

myths and prejudice surrounding the search for sanctuary in England's green but sometimes not so pleasant land. Adults and young people took part in a discussion after the performance to explore what it means for them and Leicester. "We have to support our fellow human beings" said one contributor.
